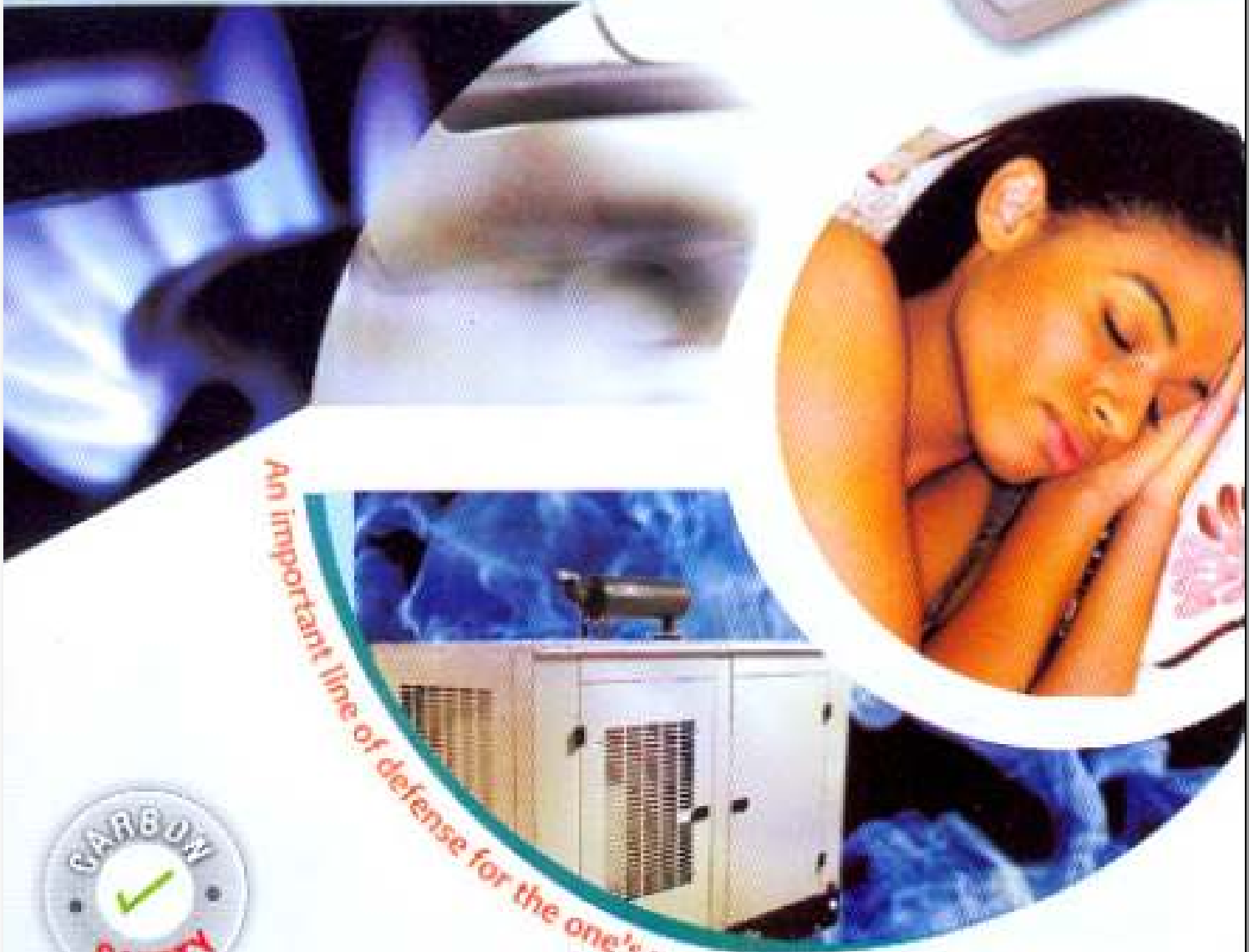

Carbon Monoxide

Carbon monoxide (CO) is produced when natural gas, oil, coal or petrol do not burn completely. It has no smell, taste or colour and is, therefore, difficult to detect. In the home this can emanate from generating set, gas appliances and fire. Inhaling carbon monoxide reduces the blood's ability to carry oxygen to vital organs and cells within the body and causes body tissue and cells to die.

Carbon monoxide poisoning can be a slow process, or happen with a few hours if there is a lot of CO in the air. It can be a silent killer and about 500 people die in their homes each year from accidental poisoning and approximately 2,000 are seriously injured.

Some people are more susceptible to poisoning, i.e. those with heart or breathing problems, babies, small children and pets. Carbon monoxide can also have severe effects on the fetus of a pregnant woman.

SYMPTOMS

- Mild carbon monoxide poisoning - similar to those of viral cold and flu infections or food poisoning. Headache, nausea, abdominal pain, dizziness, sore throat and dry cough, but there would be no high temperature.
- More severe poisoning can result in a fast and irregular heart rate, hyperventilation, convulsion, drowsiness and difficulty breathing. Seizures and loss of consciousness may also occur.
- Some symptoms can occur a few days or even months after exposure to carbon monoxide. These may include convulsion, loss of memory and problems with coordination.

PRECAUTION AND SAFETY MEASURES

- Have your generator/plant checked regularly.
- Make sure rooms are ventilated and air vents are not blocked.
- Fit carbon monoxide detector - available at INFINEON.
- Never run cars, motorbikes or lawnmowers in a closed garage
Be aware of the symptoms and look out for them. Other people in your home or workplace may be showing signs.
